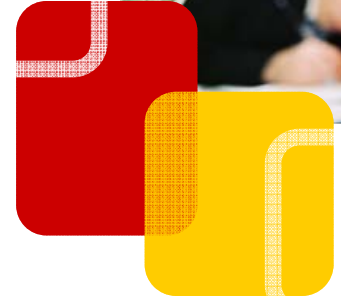

Principals, teachers and senior leaders in education will benefit from participation in this conference, as Professor Zhao will explore the importance of embedding an international dimension into the school curriculum and community, and how this can be achieved.

Participants will be provided with tools and practical examples to assist them to provide deep teaching and learning practices that embed ICT, global understanding and digital citizenship, allowing students to meet the challenges of the changing knowledge societies and the digital age.

Professor Zhao:

Yong is a University Distinguished Professor of educational psychology with interests in internet based learning environments, technology evolution and adoption, language acquisition and literacy, and perceptual control theory. At Michigan State University, USA, he directs the Center for Technology and Teaching and the U.S.-China Center. His current research projects include a social constructivist analysis of technology adoption in schools, designing an internet-based multimedia literacy environment, and examining the cognitive and affective effects of computer-mediated learning communities.

There is no question that our globe has become smaller; economic, political and technological forces have shrunk geological distances and reduced political boundaries. Our students will enter a world that will be even smaller, even more integrated and even more interconnected. We must prepare them for this new world.

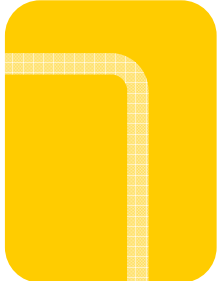
